Dr. Jenae Pitts Murdock our Interim Pastor, has encouraged the servant leaders and members of the congregation in times like these, if you will, "to encourage one another with these words":

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (I Thessalonians 5: 16-18)

"Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your request be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. (Philippians 4: 6-8)

When I read these verses, the word that resonates in my mind and heart is *always*. Always means all the way, at all times, perpetually, and forever.
